- 1. Sarah Witney out lined a possible Japanese Knotweed problem a 3<sup>rd</sup> party company has identified a deep routed plant in the bed next to the tennis courts, to the left of the entrance as dwarf Japanese knotweed (fallopian japonica var.compacta). The council are to send their contractors to investigate
- 2. Rob Leitch has obtained the required paper work from the council. A Partnership Agreement needs to be completed, public liability insurance obtained and a risk assessment needs to be completed.
- 3. Sarah has requested some insurance quotes
- 4. There is also the need to appoint a committee to sign the agreement and agree the risks and mitigations.
- 5. Roger Harris, Tom Baker, Pauline ??, Anne Isenberg, Rob Leitch, Malcom ?? and Sarah Witney volunteered for roles and those present agreed.
- 6. Sarah is to be Secretary and Rob will be acting treasurer
- 7. Rob has asked volunteers if they agree to their email addresses being shared and only a couple have asked to be removed. Two additional members of the distribution list asked to be removed as they are not able commit to the group
- 8. It was agreed that we would meet on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of the month during the winter. This would make the next meeting the 14<sup>th</sup> of November (1pm-4pm). The following work party will be on the 12<sup>th</sup> of December (9.30am-12.30pm).
- 9. A date will be set in half term for some planting Tuesday 27th October from 1000hrs.
