	The nests of the elusive Harvest Mouse are easily overlooked however. For this reason, we are going to make a concerted effort to conduct a nest search for one of Britain and Europe's smallest rodents. We are hoping that he can bring one of these old nests along to help us identify what we should be looking for.
